Purpose

To update the Board on preparations for UKREiiF 2026 (**The UK's Real Estate Investment and Infrastructure Forum**) and to outline the strategic opportunities for business engagement and inward investment.

- Provide support to attend the event.

Executive Summary

UKREiiF 2026 represents a significant platform to showcase our region's economic strengths and attract investment.

Preparations are on track, with a draft agenda, marketing activity in planning, and sponsorship negotiations progressing. Current spend is within expected parameters, and next steps focus on finalising pavilion design and securing partner commitments.

Norfolk and Suffolk local government partners have already agreed to fund attendance at UKREiiF.

Whilst good progress has been made on preparations for the event, the intended headline was planned to be the launch of the Norfolk and Suffolk Mayor. With the election of the Mayor having been delayed by government until 2028, additional work is needed to secure appropriate senior speakers and panellists to ensure the Norfolk and Suffolk Pavilion remains attractive to visitors and investors. The Norfolk and Suffolk Business Boards are asked to support this process.

Key Progress

A Norfolk and Suffolk 'Pavilion' has been booked for the 3-day event. It is intended there will be 5-7 sessions over the course of the event, which will be a mix of panel sessions, breakfast/drinks networking events, and keynote speaker events.

- Coordinate logistics for participating businesses.
- Develop a focus session for Norfolk and Suffolk.
